The construct of glocal talents broadly defined as those who think globally and act locally is coined as an attempt to bring into meaningful relationship educational ideals widely discussed in China and internationally in recent years, including global citizenship (discussed and researched world-wide), international talents (a term mainly used in China) and internationalisation at home (gaining momentum internationally more recently).
